PROFILE

I am a biological oceanographer with a research record in the biology, ecology and sustainable management of living marine resources in the Antarctic, South Atlantic, Peru Current, USA, Ireland and the UK. I have published some 130 papers in the primary scientific literature and I have also co-authored two books and co-edited one book and six symposium journal special issues.

I was a Board Member and Head of the Biological Sciences Division at BAS from 2000 - 2010. As Head of Biology I managed about eighty staff, including students and post docs. As a board member I developed policy and undertook strategic and business planning for a complex, multidisciplinary science organisation. I was Principal Scientist for the South Georgia Government Fisheries Laboratory at King Edward Point from 2001 until 2013 and was responsible for the planning and design of the base and for preparation of the Science Plan. The Laboratory supports research which underpins an ecosystem approach to fisheries management in Antarctic waters and in turn delivers science for UK Government policy in the context of CCAMLR (Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources). In 2010 I was appointed to the NERC Science Innovation and Strategy Board for a term of three years. In 2014 I was elected to the South Georgia Association Executive Committee and in the same year I joined the Board of Trustees at Gilbert White's House and the Oates Museum at Selborne, Hampshire.

I have supervised, or co-supervised ten PhD students, all successfully, and I have an established track record of interdisciplinary research, commissioned research and international collaboration. I was an honorary Professor in the School of Biological Sciences, University of Aberdeen from 2001 - 2016. I retired from the British Antarctic Survey in 2013 and am now an emeritus fellow.
